Dissolution of International Research Institute for Nuclear  
Decommissioning

Our institute was established on August 1, 2013, under the Act on Research and Development Partnership and with the authorization of the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry. Our urgent issue was to conduct testing and research related to decommissioning for damaged nuclear power plants of Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station, to improve the technical capabilities of our members, and to facilitate the practical application of these technologies.

With the aim of strengthening the foundation for decommissioning technologies, we have dedicated ourselves to the research and development of technologies that is essential for the unprecedented challenges of the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station decommissioning. We have also actively collaborated with relevant domestic and international organizations and engaged in human resource development within the field of the decommissioning R&D.

As there were unfinished projects, we obtained authorization on April 13, 2023, to amend the time of dissolution of our organization as originally stipulated in the Articles of Incorporation, thereby allowing us to focus on completing the ongoing R&D projects.

Since we have completed R&D for our final project at the Naraha Center for Remote Control Technology Development, on April 7, 2026, we transported the developed equipment to the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station. We also started and finished to dismantle the mock-up facility –which simulated actual site conditions– that had been installed at the Naraha Center for Remote Control Technology Development.

Since achieved our objectives, we passed a resolution to dissolve our institute at an extraordinary General Meeting hold today. We hereby announce that our institute will be dissolved on September 30.
